The Staunton and Hall families from Liverpool and the rest of the 48 victims of the crash should not be forgotten at this time.

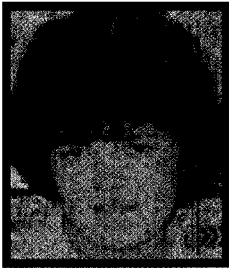
God bless them all and grant them eternal peace.

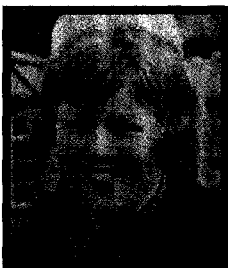
